# 2020-2021 Impact Report

# A year of adapting and perservering



ONE TO ONE entered the 2020-2021 school year knowing that a focus on flexibility and adaptability — along with maintaining a strong connection between tutors and students — would determine a successful year. The pandemic brought uncertainty to students, parents, teachers and schools and we all worked together to support young readers. Here's what we were excited to share about this year:

## Piloting new programs

For the first time in our 30-year history, we navigated through a year where we could not operate our in-person tutoring program. We knew the need for literacy tutoring did not disappear and we sought out other ways to boost young readers' literacy skills through our pilot virtual programs.

#### The result:

### 267 young readers supported

- 111 students from the Metro Vancouver area
- 90 students from around the province
- 66 additional students supported through our spring virtual reading program

We also supported **111** parents and caregivers through Come Read With Me workshops.

While we served fewer students this year than in pre-pandemic times, we take pride in the effect we had on these students.

- 93% of parents noticed an improvement in their child's confidence in reading out loud after tutoring sessions.
- 91% of teachers surveyed reported an improvement in their student's reading comprehension.
- **98%** of parents intend to enroll their child in our programs next year.

# An engaged community

Our programs and mission would not be possible without close collaboration between volunteers, schools, donors, parents and partner organizations that were dedicated to helping emerging young readers during this tumultuous school year.

Even when we were not physically together, our community stepped up to support our students by connecting them to our literacy programs and providing valuable feedback on our new initiatives this year.

In our annual winter campaign, our supporters helped us raise \$62,400 with the help of our generous matching donors from the Francis Family Foundation, Collings Stevens Family Foundation and Malberry Foundation.

In the spring, an anonymous mother-and-son duo donated and also challenged our community to contribute, raising a combined total of over \$8,000 in the Put a Book in Their Hands fundraiser, which let children pick out and take home their own special books as a graduation gift.

We would like to extend a sincere thank you to our community who have been cheering on our tutors and students.

### Our talented volunteers

Our volunteers stepped up to the challenge of learning new ways to interact with and encourage young students through a screen. Over 60 volunteers learned to use Zoom and Epic! to connect with and tutor young students. 92% of our virtual tutors intend to join us again in the next school year!

Like most things in 2020-2021, everything wasn't always smooth and we identified ways to improve for next year such as finding quieter spaces to read and even more support for our virtual tutors.

# The highlights

The 2020-2021 school year held many firsts for ONE TO ONE and for the students we support.

Launched **2** successful virtual pilot programs.

**\$8,000** raised by our community in the Put a Book in Their Hands campaign.

Re-trained **60** volunteer tutors to equip them with virtual tools used in their sessions.

**\$62,400** raised in our winter fundraising campaign.

Supported parents with **3** new tools:

- Come Read With Me workshops.
